Rate Per Student: € 2,000* (Price host family - based on minimum number of 12 students. Up to 18 students, group will be allocated in one classroom. From 19 students on, group will be split in two or more classes.

Extra cost for classes with fewer than 12 students: € 750 (per group)

Student Price Includes 3 weeks: Business English Tuition, Host Family, return airport group transfer & Included Outside Visits.

It is recommended/advised for groups (especially those including minors) to have one leader always on site during the period of their stay.

Business & Professional Development Course - See Attached Sample Timetable:

A closed group course specially designed to provide a business English curriculum with professional development and 3 outside visits. All course materials, Business Examination and End of Course Certificate included.

INCLUDED – Host Family 20 or 21 nights:

Host Family accommodation on full board accommodation (2-3 students per family, in twin/triple rooms for students travelling together) with packed lunch.

Individual students (not part of a group): they may form twin/triple rooms with other students travelling in the same dates or stay in a single room if sharing is not possible.

Single room supplement: €40 per week per student.

special dietary restrictions:

Dietary restrictions available: Vegetarian, Coeliac and Lactose intolerant - additional €30 per week per student.

NOTE: Halal and vegan diet options are not available.

Not Included:

LEAP Card (Public Transport ticket valid for all public transport) + €80 for 3 weeks. Please note that this is needed if staying in Host Family accommodation in Dublin.

**Student Residence in Dublin City available in July & August only on request:
(Additional charge/fee)**

If this option is chosen, your group will be placed in a Student Residence building located in the city. Single rooms with private bathrooms. Residential supplement for Self-Catering Single en-suite accommodation **€300 for 21 nights**. - Student residence only for students **18+ years**

Included Outside Visits: Two Company Visits as part of the program included – examples are EPIC + Croke Park. Walking Tour of City Centre on first Monday included. 1 cultural afternoon per week included – examples are National Museum, National Art Gallery, Collins Barracks.

Airport Transfers (Dublin Airport ↔ Accommodation)

Return airport transfers are included **only** for group bookings of **12 or more students, provided that the group arrives together** on the same flight at the same time.

For individual students and arrivals, transfers need to be arranged independently. Dublin's public transport offers an easy and inexpensive option.

Course Planning:

- Tailored Business English programme to meet the specific needs of each group in preparation for the Kaufmann International Certificate. The class timetable is delivered both morning and afternoon. Morning classes will focus on specific language development while the afternoon programme is a mix of Company visits, self-study and teacher-led preparation for the end of course presentation. In total the programme duration is 33 hours per week.
- Project which will be graded at the end of the programme (percentage)
- Final internal test, graded as a percentage
- Students would need to bring an electronic device on which they can do their assignment (laptop/tablet)
- Ongoing assistance during their stay
- Emergency number 24/7

Course Specific Objectives:

- Allow the trainee to improve his/her overall English language level and become more confident speaking English.
- Focus on business English language skills for use in the trainee's professional development
- Better understand the history & culture of Ireland and its economic system.
- Be able to make a presentation effectively and confidently.
- Be able to write business letters, reports with proposals, memos, and emails.
- Allow the trainee to understand his personal strengths and weaknesses in English.

Project Work Module:

- All trainees will work on a presentation during the course.
- Each candidate will make a prepared 15-minute presentation in the final week.

Assessment Procedure: Formal examination on the Thursday morning of the final week. Participants will complete a written and oral exam including presentation of a completed project.

Terms of Business: Bookings are subject to availability of dates. Free cancellation up to 3 months prior to travel; full amount applies thereafter. Travel insurance is strongly recommended.
