Host Family Accommodation 20 or 21 nights:

Your group will be placed with carefully selected host families in Dublin convenient to the bus routes to the school (Public Transport is not included). Twin rooms or some single rooms to be provided, on a half board basis, i.e., Breakfast and evening meal included. Any special dietary requirements - additional €40 per week per student. Student Residence or Shared apartment in Dublin City: (Additional charge/ fee)

If this option is chosen, your group will be placed in a Student Residence building located in the city. Single rooms with private bathrooms. Self-catering only i.e. no meals are included.

Fully equipped kitchen and laundry facilities. Arrival must be on Sundays and departure on Saturdays.. Students must be **18+ years** old to stay in student residence single rooms.

Shared apartment

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Fully equipped kitchen and laundry facilities. A deposit of €100 cash per person is required on arrival. This deposit will be returned after check-out. Students must be **19+ years** old to stay in shared apartments.

Included Outside Visits: Two outside Company Visits / Or a company trainer comes to the school. In addition, a weekend full day trip to another city can be booked for an additional fee of 60€.

Airport Transfers not included: Airport Transfers (Dublin Airport ↔ Accommodation)

- Group Booking: €120 return (students must arrive on the same flight)
- Individual Booking: €75 each way

Alternatively, participants can arrange their own transfer using Dublin's public transport, which is an inexpensive option

Course Planning:

- Prior to arrival, the participant will take an online test (written test) to define their level of language.
- A needs analysis questionnaire will be completed by each trainee to define more precisely and validate the content of the course.
- An orientation session will be provided on the first day of the programme to introduce the staff and the training programme.
- Students would need to bring an electronic device on which they can do their assignment (laptop/tablet)

Course Specific Objectives:

- Allow the participant to improve his/her overall English language level and become more confident speaking English.
- Focus on business English language skills for use in the trainee's professional development
- Better understand the history & culture of Ireland and its economic system.
- Be able to make a presentation effectively and confidently.
- Be able to write business letters, reports with proposals, memos, and emails.
- Allow the trainee to understand his personal strengths and weaknesses in English.

Project Work Module:

- All trainees will work on a presentation during the internship.
- Each candidate will make a prepared 15-minute presentation in the final week.

Assessment Procedure:

- Formal examination on the Thursday morning of the final week. Participants will have a choice of 6 questions from the subjects taught, 3 questions must be answered with 200 words written in response to each question.
- An assessment of each participants speaking level – each candidate will make a prepared 15-minute presentation

Terms of Business:

Bookings are subject to availability of dates. **Booking needs to be made at least 3 months in advance.** Free cancellation up to 3 months prior to travel; full amount applies thereafter. Travel insurance is strongly recommended.
